- To have at least one CADS trained instructor at every ski & snowboard resort in Canada

Strategies

- 1. Provide tools and services to support growth of Programs and Divisions
- 2. Provide operational services and IT infrastructure to streamline and support efficiencies
- 3. Provide insurance coverages and tools to members and organizations prudent risk management and governance
- 4. Support volunteer recruitment, identify humain ressource needs and create retention strategies
- 5. Provide leadership training, operational infrastructure and sports equipment for delivery of quality programming

- 1. Support recruitment and retention initiatives of CADS Programs
- 2. Continuous improvement of our world-class training and certification curriculum
- 3. Increase the number of trainers to train and certify instructors and volunteers
- 4. Creation of educational resources that are accessible to instructors, volunteers and students
- 5. Continued collaboration with able bodied instructor organizations and ski resorts

Strategies

- 1. Provide local, regional & national events and training camps for participants to be active for life or to strive for competitive excelence
- 2. Improve accessibility of adaptive snowsport equipment for participants
- 3. Increase our pool of Certified Coaches, Para-Coaches and Adaptive or Para-athletes for both Alpine & Snowboard
- 4. Expanded our collaboration with National Sport Organizations in support of our role as a feeder system for Canada's Paralympic snowsport teams
- 5. Expand our communication reach to communities and disability sport organizations to increase recreational & competitive opportunities

Performance Indicators

- 1. # or % of participants who are classifiable according to the International Paralympic Committee (IPC)
- 2. # of Canadian Paralympic team members who progressed thru CADS Programs
- 3. # of training camps days & quality competitions

Foster organizational sustainability of local, regional, provincial and national CADS organizations

Strategies

- 1. Raise and direct significant funds to help CADS organizations reach their goals (the Big Need)
- 2. Establish key long-term partnerships with National sponsorship organizations (the Big Ask)
- 3. Cultivate partnerships with Disability Organizations and relevant health, charities, foundations and government organizations
- 4. Establish strategic service agreements with divisions and large programs to ensure alignment of roles and responsabilities so that organisations are financially sustainable and grants/bursaries have an impact on targeted goals
- 5. Develop stronger relationships within the Snowsport industry to increase awareness, inclusion and accessibility at Resorts
