Executive Summary

The [Canadian Anti-Doping Program \(CADP\)](#) is generally considered to be one of the most thorough and comprehensive doping control policies in the world. By operating on the basis of a collective agreement within the sport, the policy provides for a truly independent, transparent and cost-effective anti-doping system. It also provides the procedural fairness and protects the athletes' rights throughout the process.

The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) is the custodian of the CADP, the set of rules that govern anti-doping in Canada. The CADP consists of several components such as in- and out-of-competition testing, education, medical exemptions, and the consequences of doping violations. The CADP is compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and all international standards.

CADS has adopted the CADP which means that you can be confident that you are part of a world-class anti-doping program that is designed to protect athletes' rights and ensure a level playing field. CADS anti-doping policy and code of conduct reflect and support the CADP.

While the CCES administers anti-doping for the Canadian sport community, you may also be subject to the rules of your international federation.

All CADS Instructors, Evaluators, and Course Conductors are encouraged to complete the [NCCP Leading Drug-Free Sport Module](#).

As a member of CADS, the CADP applies to you!

It is important to know that by participating in activities sanctioned by CADS, you may be selected for doping control.

Adherence

By adhering to this policy, we are committed to promoting the health and safety of our instructors and participants while ensuring the continued success of our training programs.

All CADS members must sign to confirm that they have read, understand and consent to comply with this anti-doping Policy.

Policy Review and Approval

This policy was approved by CADS Board of Directors *August / 22 / 2024*.

This policy should be reviewed by the CADS HR & Policy Committee and senior staff from time to time to ensure it remains current.
